Curriculum:

- Need to create new courses that can be paired with credit classes (there is currently a wall up for noncredit Ss because they do not have the skills to advance thru the credit side)
- Need to align curriculum between credit and noncredit. Identify gaps and overlaps between credit/ noncredit courses – which would help to make transition smoother
- Need to provide dual-ticketed class where credit and noncredit students can take the class together
- Need to develop new Vocational ABE or Vocational ESL to prepare students for credit certificate programs
- Need to develop English Workplace courses to expand employability/workforce readiness skills and help with English/work communication skills
