Update on AB86 Regional Summit in Sacramento, October 6-7,2014 (Ryan, Mary Lou, Chrissy, Mary)	 Mary and Mary Lou discussed how 70 consortia are working together They were asked how a funding model would work The 4 Orange County Consortia worked well together-North Orange County, Coast Community, South County and RSCCD Chrissy discussed that she is working with the other 3 Orange County Consortia in organizing a trip to Washington to look into the IBEST program Mary Lou discussed that she was invited to partner with the 3 other Orange County Consortia to talk about how to collaborate across counties and boundaries Chrissy discussed how similar the 70 consortia's priorities are to ours Chrissy also discussed that they mentioned a state wide ID 	None

	 Mary discussed how the groups got together and had to create a news article on what the successes would look like 5 years from now and what would the consortium look like Mary discussed how important it is to stay focused on the big picture-that 500 million could be funded to the consortiums Mary discussed that they asked the groups to come up with ideas of what the funding model would look like and there was a graphic organizer describing their ideas Chrissy discussed by listening to the legislature we need to send up the best report that we can and it is up to our Governor/Legislature to vote for the funding 	
October 31st Reports (Chrissy and Mary) Progress on Narrative Questions on Charts/Tables	 Chrissy sent out the charts for everyone to look over and asked if they are all being represented Chrissy talked about the Apprenticeship programs-students need a GED or HSS diploma along with Algebra 1 to enter into most Apprenticeship programs SCC has the largest apprenticeship program in CA-over 3,900 students enrolled There are 7 apprenticeship programs at SCC-some of which are: Carpentry, Welding, Cosmetology, Lineman and Plumbing – 2 or 3 of these align with the AA degree The students would enroll through a training trust in Orange County, but they would receive college credits Once you begin the Apprenticeship program you are paid Chrissy is going to visit a Carpentry Union for information and a tour, and would like to set up a referral program to OEC/CEC for students who need to complete pre-requisites SAC has career technical classes Chrissy is working on the narrative due October 31st-she wrote 36 pages and can expect to write 20 or 30 more 	Chrissy will check to see if we need to fill out the columns for the expected enrollment for 2015-2016. It was not to be included in the July 31 report.

	 Chrissy is updating the narrative and highlighting in yellow Lisa is working on creating visual graphs and pulling data together to add to narrative 	
	 Chrissy passed out 2 maps that Lisa is working on-trying to identify where the students live in relation to where they are taking classes A lot of students enroll in areas where they work Lincoln Education Center-there is a huge cluster of students living in this area Chrissy suggested to Nancy that she can give Lisa the students ID, address and classes they are taking and she can add to the maps Mary states that Jose is including credit basic skills and ESL to the narrative. If we don't add to the October 31st report we can add to December 31st report Mary discussed the funds from AB86 will be in addition to our regular funding The importance of returning dedicated funding to the adult ed programs was discussed by the K-12's at the AB86 Summit Chrissy discussed that there still are no answers to if we are getting funding when they attended the conference Mary discussed that we all need to make sure the reports are accurate and reflecting everyone's needs 	Chrissy will send out the narrative on 10/20 for everyone to take a look-add comments in RED so she can change
Update on current collaborations (All) SAUSD AWD class at CEC Boys and Girls Club Possible new classes at GGUSD and OCDE	 Chrissy states that 50 SAUSD surveys came back and 400 from the jail Ed states that SAUSD has 3 or 4 surveys out to his parents Ed would like to add more data to the survey-he is sending the link to 8,000 parents using an auto dialer and auto email 3 events are being held at The Boys and Girls Club-one of 	Chrissy will add the new information from the surveys to the Dec 31 st report

- CEC is working on offering a retail office clerk stackable certificate
- CTEP is a new word for ROP consortium-
- Nilo and Mariella are working on articulation agreements with credit CTE
- Chrissy discussed that CEC is in talks with GGUSD at Lincoln Education Center to bring CTE and Spanish GED classes to their site
- Chrissy, Mary Lou and Ryan are discussing the use of the Harbor Learning Center for additional adult classes
- Chrissy discussed that SAUSD, SAC and OCDE are all working together to open new SWD classes
- Chrissy discussed that they are trying to add a self advocacy class —to teach students how to prepare and ask questions without parent involvement for the adults with disabilities programs
- **Ryan** discussed how students are relying on parents and teachers-they aren't used to speaking on their own
- There are 33 adults with disabilities students enrolled at CEC from SAUSD
- Kerri discussed there are 122 adult transition students in the Orange Unified school district at Yorba middle school
- Chrissy discussed that transitional students have to be dually enrolled to be counted
- Kerri discussed their Adult CTE and Adult transition programs lost 2 million in funding-2 coordinators-Kathy Boyd-CTE and Rachael Dale-transition will be willing to collaborate
- Nilo suggested arranging another meeting to discuss more about the CTE classes in the other districts
- Chrissy discussed salary surfer-this compares the salaries of careers with HSS diplomas and college educated – some of

What's next	 Mary Lou and Kerri discussed that the special Ed students don't have a clear pathway program Some students tend to drop out and end up in jail Byron stated the money for OCDE was excluded for counseling Chrissy discussed that STEP run by non-credit counseling at SAC and STARS is run through non-credit counseling for HSS at SCC Mary Lou suggested by meeting with the other 4 consortium we might offer what they are offering-what has worked for them Ed discussed that the ESL and citizenship classes seem to lack organization that are held at SAUSD sites Chrissy suggested that we write into the plan a need for an additional site liaison to work with adult Ed and the SAUSD site principals 	
	 Nilo discussed that either we request a class to be held at the site or the principal requests a class from the parents Jarek discussed that there are 2 obstacles while working with SAUSD sites-not enough rooms available and no babysitting offered-could be addresses with additional funding 	Ed will check with cabinet to see if SAUSD would want a liaison for ESL, Citizenship and Basic Skills classes
