### Computers for ABE/ASE

**Budget: \$19,000** 

- \$19,000 to purchase new computers for ABE/ASE classrooms at SCC).
- Math/science classrooms for now, but may be multi-discipline in the future.
   Older computers 5-10 years old.
- Chrissy shared that not all computer proposals have gone through strategy workgroup. CEC CTE room will have their computers AEBG funded.
- No additional software will need to be purchased as the school already has site licenses.
- Same number of computers will be needed before and after the move.

## Professional Learning Community Budget: \$30,000

 Ray gave a summary of the PLC to the SPW: Small group of teachers met to discuss writing across the curriculum; broke into groups, discussed strategies and focused on what is a paragraph, sentence, etc.; looked at what we doing in the class to ensure students

	are writing at appropriate level; looked at a lot of different standards; asked what students should be able to do upon exit  Rob discussed the premise of the PLC – looking at student work and discussing it, how outcomes build on each other, doing research, listening to presentations on methods, creating assessments.  Proposal is to expand the CEC PLC to OEC and GG. Funding is to pay teachers.  Funding covers from now until June 2018.  Members can be paid in flex (CEC/OEC), or non-instructional rate.  To accommodate the multiple schools participating, Rob proposed one hour as a group, the second as a pull-out  Ray talked about "level meetings" in K-12, which were very helpful and serve a similar "level discussion" purpose  Chrissy asked for more details on the costs.  Lori said that SAC used to be well known for its PLC.  Karla asked about the researcher being a resource to help determine how to measure outcomes.  We can now contact the researcher directly  Chrissy showed us how to contact the
